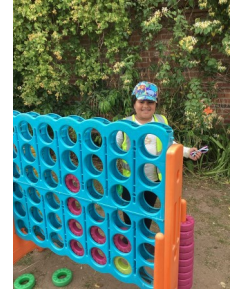

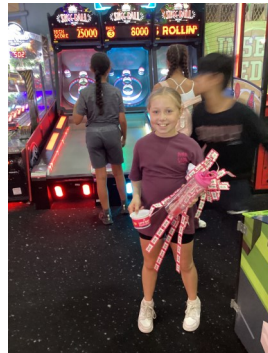
On Friday the children from Little Acorns Nursery loved seeing the animals from Joe's Exotic Zoo and Mobile Petting Farm.

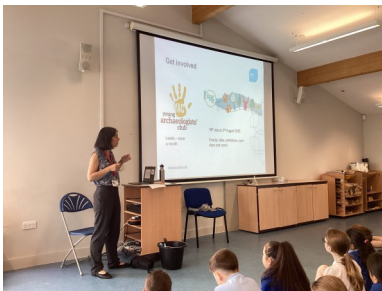

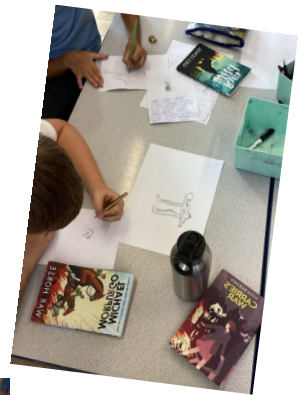
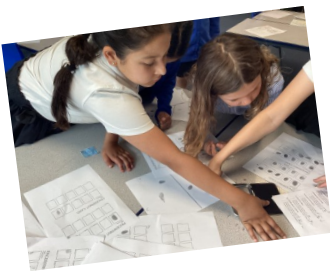

NEW TO RECEPTION PARENTS COFFEE MORNING



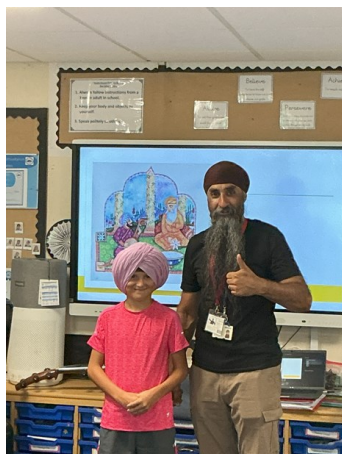
The parents enjoyed a coffee and a chat whilst the children explored their new classrooms.

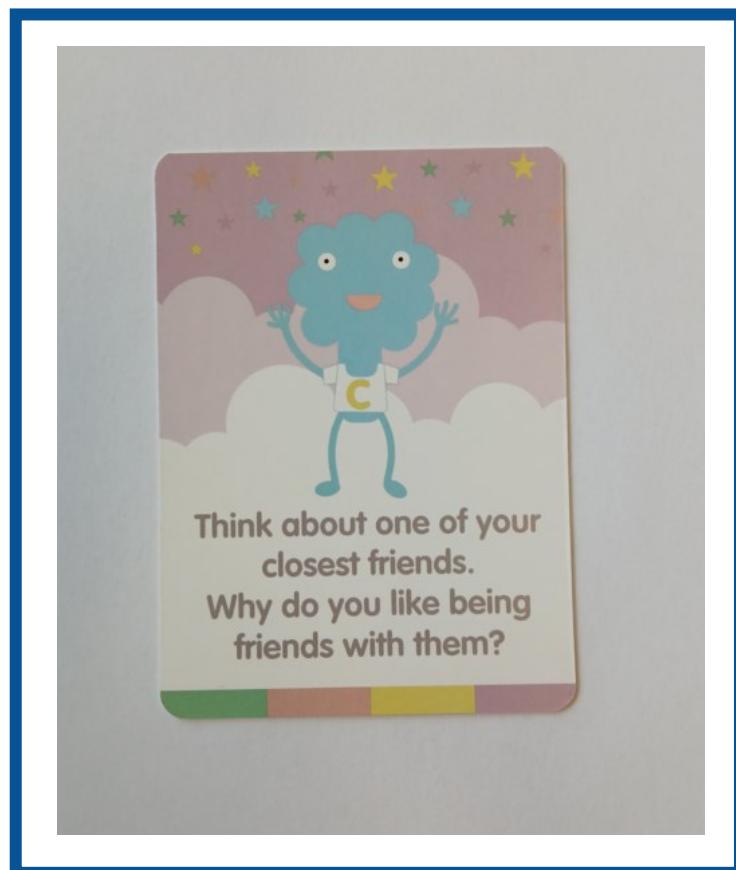

PE in Action

At Swain House Primary School, we recognise the important role Physical Education plays in promoting children's health, wellbeing, confidence and personal growth. We aim to create a positive environment where all pupils enjoy being active, develop new skills and build healthy habits that can last a lifetime.



Alongside weekly PE lessons, every child participates in a dance programme delivered with the Yorkshire Academy of Creative Arts & Dance. Pupils learn different dance styles, develop performance skills and work together to master a class routine before showcasing their achievements to the school community.

In Early Years and Key Stage 1, children develop core physical skills such as balance, coordination, agility and control through activities including gymnastics, ball skills, multi-skills and outdoor learning. These experiences build confidence and establish strong foundations for future participation in sport.

As they progress into Key Stage 2, pupils apply and extend these skills through a wider range of individual and team sports. The curriculum includes football, netball, hockey, tag rugby, cricket, rounders, athletics, golf, ultimate frisbee, gymnastics and orienteering, helping children develop teamwork, resilience and a broad range of sporting abilities.



We have been incredibly fortunate this year to work alongside the Jason Robinson Foundation, a charity dedicated to inspiring young people through sport, education and positive role models. The foundation aims to help children develop confidence, resilience and teamwork skills while encouraging healthy and active lifestyles. Our pupils have thoroughly enjoyed the coaching sessions delivered by Coach Jonny, whose energy, enthusiasm and expertise have had a positive impact across the school. We are delighted that Jonny will be returning in September, and we look forward to continuing our partnership

with the foundation and providing even more exciting opportunities for our children

Opportunities to be active continue beyond lesson time through extracurricular clubs, including football, swimming, cheerleading, dance, ultimate frisbee and multi-skills. These activities enable pupils to further develop their interests and enjoy sport in a fun and supportive setting.



We also provide regular opportunities for children to represent the school in competitions and festivals. This year, pupils have participated in events including football, netball, cricket, golf, ultimate frisbee and multi-skills, developing sportsmanship, determination and pride in their achievements.

A particular highlight was the return of the temporary swimming pool on the school site during the Autumn Term. This allowed all Year 4 pupils to take part in daily swimming lessons, improving both their swimming ability and water safety awareness.

Through our inclusive PE curriculum, we aim to encourage every child to enjoy physical activity, embrace challenges and develop a lifelong apprecia-

Bradford Safer Driving Sessions

West Yorkshire Police are offering drivers in Bradford a **FREE** road safety course. The session is divided into key sections addressing common road safety concerns, including anti-social vehicle use, particularly in urban and suburban areas. Drivers will be provided with practical safety tips, statistics, and involved in community engagement to encourage safer behaviours on the roads.

The session aims to help attendees:

- **Understand West Yorkshire Vision Zero** and its goal of eliminating road death and serious injuries by 2040.
- **Recognise road safety challenges in** – identify key risks and factors contributing to road incidents in the region.
- **Analyse data and trends** – interpret local road safety statistics and understand how Vision Zero policies aim to improve safety.
- **Explore solutions and strategies** – discuss infrastructure, enforcement, education and policy changes designed to reduce collisions.
- **Promote safer road use** – describe individual and community actions that contribute to achieving Vision Zero.
