SCIENCE IN ACTION

"A scientist is not a person who gives the right answers, they are the one who asks the right questions"

At Swain House Primary School, we aim to teach a broad and balanced curriculum for science. We want our children to think like scientists and have no limits to their ambitions. Science stimulates children's natural curiosity and at Swain House we aim to develop this through exciting and engaging hands on science. Children learn to ask scientific questions and begin to appreciate the way science will affect their future on a personal, national, and global level.





This year, we have been on science based trips to

develop a love of science. Year 6 visited STEMFest in Bradford, which hosted a huge range of science and technology activities. The event involved around 80 companies delivering hands-on activities, showcasing the wide range of careers and job roles available in the Yorkshire and Humber regions. There were activities with robots, code breaking, programming computers, aerodynamics and much more.

Nursery had a special visit from a scientist called Gaynor, who delivered a forces and motion workshop. Our children used cars, marbles, and pendulums to create some large-scale artwork.





We love to celebrate British Science Week at Swain House. This year's theme was 'Change and Adapt'. It is a brilliant celebration of science, where the children

complete a range of incredible investigations and are wowed by awesome experiments. We started the week with an exciting assembly led by Mr Gibbs and Mrs Pugh and watched some live experiments.

During our careers week this year, we welcomed a range of visitors from scientific fields. Caroline and Donna worked for the NHS Blood and Transplant Team and explained why it is important for adults to give blood. Sarah and Ben worked in Data Science for the NHS. They told us the important information that is collected regarding hospitals, ambulances and doctor surgeries.

Our science curriculum is full of engaging activities to spark an enjoyment of science and encourage learning—here is just an idea of the amazing learning our children have done this year! Year 1 have been learning about plants and have planted sunflowers. Year 4 have made use of our wildlife area and have been hunting for minibeasts. Year 6 have been learning about classification and used sweets to group by characteristics. Year 2 have been studying living things and their habitats and went on a hunt in our wildlife area.
